IBC

Deep holes are still appearing all over the park which is a potential trip/safety hazard. Nothing has been done about this issue. Concern was expressed that this could be more of an issue when the goalposts are installed shortly.

It was suggested that the friends could fill in the holes themselves, however there were initial concerns regarding liability should someone injure themselves on the newly filled holes.

The group were reassured by Councillors that they would not be held liable for this, therefore the three officers present at the meeting, plus Paul Gilbert volunteered to fill in the holes on Sunday 10th June.

There was some confusion as a result of the unsuitability of the venue, and while members were making arrangements to do this, Cllr Connelly emailed IBC to request topsoil, which unfortunately would not have arrived before the date arranged to fill holes.

Several park users had been attacked by a pair of crows protecting their offspring which had fallen from the nest. The chair contacted the Park Rangers, who then moved the young crow to the orchard area. Unfortunately, it was then attacked and killed by magpies.

The Chair was told afterwards this has happened often in previous years and that the baby should have been left alone. However, the safety of park users was of paramount importance and the group was of the opinion that if this happens in the future, an alternative method needs to be worked out to protect both park users and the birds.

Bottles are being smashed in the park and drug dealing is still an issue. These issues need to be reported to the police if seen.
